PUBLIC PORTION:

Mr. Mercado opened the public portion.

Sam Sweet of Erial asked Council to table Resolution 344 because the public did not have time to review. Mr. Mercado stated these transfers need to be completed before the end of the year. Mr. Sweet questioned the \$675k transfer to group insurance. Mr. Cardis explained the township is self-funded meaning funds are estimated for what may be needed for medical and prescription accounts. Mr. Sweet asked if there was a shortage in group health insurance. Mr. Cardis stated yes.

Peter Heinbaugh of Morningstar Court asked Council, in regards to Resolution 337 involving rejection of the hockey rink project bids, what was wrong with the submissions. Mr. Cardis stated Area 51 did not submit a bid bond, an Iran clause, and was deficient in many ways and the other submitter was over the township budget. Mr. Cardis explained that since the township went out for bid twice for this project unsuccessfully, the township can now negotiate with contractors for this project. Mr. Heinbaugh asked Council what the police are hoping to acquire through Resolution 338. Chief Harkins explained this resolution enables police to be approved to look at equipment at no cost.

Denise Coyne of Chews Landing Rd asked Council, in regards to Resolution 345, how a resolution such as this becomes initiated and who decides these lots are in need redevelopment. Mr. Lechner stated the Redevelopment Engineer, T & M, makes recommendations to the Planning Board based upon state statutes and local housing law. Mrs. Coyne asked if the township gives T & M the authority to make recommendations. Mr. Cardis explained that Redevelopment Engineer is a professional service that the township awards every year at Reorganization.

Paul Krugg of Blackwood Estates asked Council if it is unreasonable that time be paused when Council responds. Mr. Mercado stated the time limit is to aid residents in being concise in asking their questions. Mr. Mercado does not believe the request to be unreasonable and will take it under advisement. Mr. Krug stated he believed the entire township had a tax abatement and was a redevelopment area based on the December 9, 2019 Council meeting and asked how this area differs. Mr. Lechner explained the whole township is not in a redevelopment area, it is a rehabilitation area. Mr. Lechner explained the difference between a redevelopment area and rehabilitation area.

There being no further comment, the public portion was closed.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER THROUGH THE GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEFENSE LOGISTICS AGENCY, LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT OFFICE, 1033 PROGRAM TO ENABLE THE GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP POLICE

**DEPARTMENT TO REQUEST AND ACQUIRE EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF
DEFENSE EQUIPMENT**

WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property making that personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies (LEAs); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county LEA's to obtain property they might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-3-.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester that the Gloucester Township Police Department is hereby authorized to enroll in the 1033 Program for no more than a one-year period, with authorization to commence on the 1st of January, 2020 and terminate on the 31st of December, 2020

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Gloucester Township Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire items of non-controlled property designated "DEMIL A," which may include office supplies, office furniture, computers, electronic equipment, generators, field packs, non-military vehicles, clothing, traffic and transit signal systems, exercise equipment, farming and moving equipment, storage devices and containers, tools medical and first aid supplies, construction materials, lighting supplies, beds and sleeping mats, wet and cold weather equipment and supplies, respirators, binoculars, and any other supplies or equipment of a non-military nature identified by the LEA, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorized, based on the needs of the Gloucester Township Police Department, without restriction; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Gloucester Township Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire the following "DEMIL B through Q" property, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; specifically (2) armored security vehicles, (2) armored cars, (2) light armored vehicles, (2) mine resistant vehicles, (2) security vehicles, (2) armored trucks, (2) cargo trucks, (2) carryall trucks, (2) panel trucks, (2) stake trucks, (2) utility trucks or (2) utility off road vehicles.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Gloucester Township Police Department shall develop and implement a full training plan and policy for the maintenance and use of the acquired property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Gloucester Township Police Department shall provide a quarterly accounting of all property obtained through the 1033 Program which shall be available to the public upon request; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect on the 1st of January and shall be valid to authorize requests to acquire "DEMIL A" property and "DEMIL B through Q" property that may be made available through the 1033 Program during the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; with Program participation and all property request authorization to terminating on the 31st of December, 2020

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO AUTHORIZE THE PLANNING BOARD TO UNDERTAKE A PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION TO DETERMINE WHETHER CONDITIONS EXIST TO DESIGNATE VARIOUS PROPERTIES WITHIN MUNICIPAL TAX BLOCK 12402 OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER AS A REDEVELOPMENT AREA PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq.) provides a legal framework for establishing a redevelopment area and for comprehensively planning for the revitalization of such an area; and

WHEREAS, the Township is desirous of undertaking a planning analysis to determine if the following properties:

Block 12402, Lots 1, 2, 5, 6, 6.01, 6.02, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16

meet the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 and may be designated as a non-condemnation area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council, under the authority of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6, can request the Township of Gloucester Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether the aforementioned properties meet the statutory criteria for redevelopment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester hereby authorizes the Township of Gloucester Planning Board pursuant to N.J.S.A.

40A:12A-6(a) to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether the aforementioned properties in the study area meet the criteria specified in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 and should be designated in need of redevelopment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that as provided by law, the Planning Board shall, after giving public notice and notice to affected property owners, conduct a public hearing at which all persons who are interested in or are affected by the proposed redevelopment designation are given an opportunity to be heard; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that after completing its hearing, the Planning Board shall transmit its recommendations to the Township Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of the Resolution, assigning conduct of the investigation and public hearing on the proposed redevelopment area to the Planning Board will be transmitted to the Planning Board by the Township Clerk upon its adoption.

PUBLIC PORTION:

Mr. Mercado opened the public portion.

Paul Krugg of Blackwood Estates asked Council which of the following improvement efforts is Council directly overseeing Blackwood West Redevelopment Plan, Blackwood Arts District, The Village of Gloucester Township. Mr. Mercado explained Council is a legislative body and these projects are overseen by the administration of the Township. Mr. Krugg asked if it were possible for Triad Associates to attend a council meeting. Mr. Mercado stated Triad currently meets with the administration and the Mayor's office, but he could pass the request along. Sam Sweet of Erial asked Mr. Lechner to explain the differences between a Redevelopment Zone and a Rehabilitation area. Mr. Lechner explained the major differences. Mr. Sweet asked Council if it were feasible to, citing the Boxer Report, request the state to remove certain areas from Rehabilitation area designation. Mr. Palumbo explained the State's role in changing rehabilitation zone designations.

Peter Heinbaugh of Morningstar Court asked if there is a difference in zoning whether in a redevelopment area or rehabilitation zone. Mr. Lechner explained zoning falls under the Municipal Land Use Law and redevelopment and rehabilitation falls under local housing law. Mr. Heinbaugh asked what the future plans are for the area being studied in Resolution 345. Mr. Lechner explained that is why the study is being completed.

Denise Coyne of Chews Landing Road asked for clarification regarding the Boxer Report. Mr. Palumbo clarified. Mr. Mercado asked how old the Boxer Report is. Mrs. Coyne stated it is from 2010. Mrs. Coyne expressed that she does not understand why the area on the agenda tonight is being considered for redevelopment when it is surrounded by other redevelopment areas and should be prime real estate. Mr. Mercado explained that is why the study is taking place.

Mr. Mercado directed interested residents to submit their resumes to both the planning and zoning boards.

Sam Sweet of Erial stated the ordinance regarding designated areas as rehabilitation in the township can be rewritten after petition and application to state and asked if council will consider changing the ordinance. Mr. Sweet explained that there is no incentive for businesses to go to Blackwood Clementon Road when they can go on or near College Drive. Mr. Mercado stated he cannot give a definitive answer right now as there are only 4 residents bringing this complaint to Council's attention.

Paul Krugg of Blackwood Estates requested that Triad and the Economic Development Committee sent representatives to attend council meetings. Mr. Krugg asked how several

initiatives for redevelopment plans in the township have been executed. Mr. Mercado asked Mr. Krugg to submit specific questions ahead of the meeting so that the answers can be researched and replied to thoroughly.

There being no further comment, the public portion was closed.
