# PROCLAMATION

## Supporting the *Click It or Ticket* Mobilization May 23 – June 5, 2022

**WHEREAS**, there were 701 motor vehicle fatalities in New Jersey in 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, approximately 37% of the motor vehicle occupants killed in those traffic crashes were not wearing a seat belt; and

**WHEREAS**, use of a seat belt remains the most effective way to avoid death or serious injury in a motor vehicle crash; and

**WHEREAS**, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration estimates that 135,000 lives were saved by safety belt usage nationally between 1975-2000; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide *Click It or Ticket* seat belt mobilization from May 23 – June 5, 2022 in an effort to raise awareness and increase seat belt usage through a combination of high visibility enforcement and public education; and

**WHEREAS**, the Division of Highway Traffic Safety has set a goal of increasing the seat belt usage rate in the state from the current level of 94%; and

**WHEREAS**, a further increase in seat belt usage in New Jersey will save lives on our roadways;

**THEREFORE**, be it resolved that I, David R. Mayer, Mayor of the Township of Gloucester, and I, Orlando Mercado, Council President do hereby proclaim the Township of Gloucester's support for the *Click It or Ticket* seat belt mobilization both locally and nationally from May 23 – June 5, 2022 and pledge to increase awareness of the mobilization and the benefits of seat belt use.

**ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER ENTITLED, "POLICE DEPARTMENT"**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that Chapter 15 "Police Department" of the Code of the Township of Gloucester be and is hereby amended as follows:

**§ 15-5. Appointment and Promotions**

N.J.S.A. 40A:9-1.1 et seq. permits municipalities to require residency preferences for officers and employees; and

N.J.S.A. 40A:14-123.1a permits municipalities to establish a residency preference for appointment to municipal police departments; and

Gloucester Township ("Township") also wishes to establish a preference for residents in hiring members of the Township's Police Department;

Gloucester Township finds that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the Township to establish a residency preference for employment and/or promotions within the Township's Police Department

The Mayor and Council of Gloucester Township, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.**

(A) Applicants seeking to obtain a position in the Township's police department, who are residents of the Township, shall be given a preference when the Township determines its factors and requirements for filling a position. Notwithstanding, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-122.1, residency is not a condition of employment, but rather residency will be one of various factors when determining which individual(s) will be offered employment to become a member of the police department.

(B) Classification of applicants. Before any person shall be appointed as a member of the paid Police Department, the Appointing Authority shall classify all the duly qualified applicants for the available position or positions in the following classes:

1. Class I: residents of Gloucester Township.
2. Class II: residents of Camden County.
3. Class III: other residents of the state.
4. Class IV: all other qualified residents.

Within each such classification, duly qualified applicants who are veterans shall be accorded all such veterans preferences as are provided by law. Persons discharged from the service within six months prior to making application to such municipality, who fulfill the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-10.1 and who thereby are entitled to appointment notwithstanding their failure to meet the New Jersey residency requirement at the time of their initial application, shall be placed in Class III.

(C) Order of appointments. In making such appointments, the Appointing Authority shall first appoint all those in Class I and then those in each succeeding class in the order above listed and shall appoint a person or persons in any such class only to a vacancy or vacancies remaining after all qualified applicants in the preceding class or classes have been appointed or have declined an offer of appointment.

(D) Certification of eligibles for positions. The classes of qualified applicants defined by this section shall be considered as separate and successive lists of eligibles, and the Civil Service Commission shall, when requested to certify eligibles for positions specified in this article, make such certifications from said classes separately and successively and shall certify no person from any such class until all persons in the class or classes have been appointed or have declined offers of appointment.

Applicability. This article shall apply only to initial appointments as members of the Township's Police Department. This article shall not apply to promotions of individuals who are already members of the Township's police department.

Temporary appointments. In making temporary appointments, the Appointing Authority shall utilize the classifications set forth herein and shall classify accordingly all duly qualified applicants for the position or positions to be temporarily filled.

## **SECTION 2.**

In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance or the remaining provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.

## **SECTION 3.**

All ordinances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

## **SECTION 4.**

This Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after adoption and publication in the manner prescribed by law.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR THE FY 2021 EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT AND ENTERING INTO A SHARED SERVICES/INTER-LOCAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF CAMDEN, OTHER CAMDEN COUNTY MUNICIPALITIES AND THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN**

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Department of Justice has made available grant funds in the form of the 2021 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program for the purpose of carrying out activities to prevent and control crime; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Gloucester has been invited to apply for these funds in conjunction with five other municipalities including, Camden, Cherry Hill, Lindenwold, and Pennsauken Twp. for a grant in the amount of \$207,255.00, Gloucester Township’s allocation being approximately \$10,150.00 ; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Gloucester is required to enter into a Shared Services/Inter-Local Services Agreement with the County of Camden, designating them as the lead agency;
